



College Scholarships for Alaska Students

Important Note: The purpose of this detailed listing is to help you plan your scholarship search throughout the year. Please find information below about scholarships for Alaska students. Some of the deadlines may be from prior years. Scholarship deadlines are cyclical, so even if a deadline has passed, the website will likely be updated for the 2021-22 cycle. Be sure to reach out to the sponsor or check sponsor websites for the most recent details.

SEPTEMBER 2021

1. **The Alaska Space Grant Program** has given more than \$700,000 in awards to students in Alaska. Alaska Space Grant awards are aimed to encourage undergraduate research in science, technology engineering and math (STEM) fields and help students round out their classroom education with hands-on experience to provide a higher quality of education and prepare students to work in STEM fields after they graduate. The deadline to apply is September 15th. [More info. Here.](#)
2. **Dr. Helen Beirne Scholarship** is given to a suitably qualified candidate demonstrating a commitment to undertaking studies leading to a graduate degree in communication development and disorders. Applicants should show pursuit of studies in communication, in the area of speech/language or hearing at an accredited institution in the undergraduate or graduate department. The scholarship is valued at \$1000 and the deadline to apply is September 15th. [Read more here.](#)

NOVEMBER 2021

- 3. William Hunt Professional Development Scholarship** is only available to students in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Alaska, and Montana. The award is worth \$1,000. The scholarship is geared towards high school students from these states that are looking to study in the tourism industry while having at least two years of experience in the travel industry. The application must be turned in by November 3rd. [Read more here.](#)
- 4. Paul Hagelbarger Memorial Scholarship Fund** is for \$2,000. This is open to U.S. college juniors and seniors and graduate students who are pursuing a degree in accounting at a four-year institution in Alaska. Scholastic achievement and financial need will be considered. The deadline to apply is November 2nd. [Read more here.](#)
- 5. Kenneth D. Maynard Memorial College Scholarship Fund Program** is up to \$2,000 and available to residents of Alaska studying architecture. The scholarship committee must receive entries not later than 5:00 pm (Alaska time) on the last Friday in November. [Learn more here.](#)

DECEMBER 2021

- 6. Eklutna, Inc. Scholarship Program.** This award is for original enrollees and descendants of original enrollees of Eklutna, Inc. Applicants must be Alaskan natives and have a minimum grade point average of 2.5. The deadline is December 1st. [More info. here.](#)
- 7. Mary Lou Brown Scholarship** is for \$7500. This award is for a licensed radio amateur with a general class or higher license who is a resident of the ARRL Northwest Division area (AK, ID, MT, OR, WA). The applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher to be eligible for this award and must have a demonstrated interest in promoting the Amateur Radio Service. JANUARY 2022

- 8. Friends Of Alan Turing Scholarship** is for \$12,000. This scholarship is available for current graduate and undergraduate students who are majoring in a STEM

field (science, technology, engineering, or mathematics). Applicants must identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or as a straight-ally with a demonstrated commitment to LGBT equality, and must reside in one of the following states: Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana or Alaska. The deadline is January 8th. [More details here.](#)

9. Cancer for College Pacific Northwest Scholarship is for \$5,000. This has provided need-based college scholarships and educational experiences to cancer survivors from Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana or Alaska. Applicants must have received a cancer diagnosis at any point in the past, plan to attend a U.S. college or graduate school, and have a family income of less than \$150,000 per year. 10. The GSBA Scholarship Fund awards educational scholarships to LGBTQ and straight-ally students who are committed to making a difference in the world. Eligible applicants must reside in Washington state (those residing in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington are encouraged to apply). If you are applying for the undergraduate award you must be a high school senior, have a 3.0 GPA, and, either identify as LGBTQ, members of LGBTQ families, or straight allies who've been supportive of the LGBTQ community. 11. Alaska Travel Industry Association ranges from \$1,000-\$3000. This scholarship is open to all Alaska high school seniors interested in pursuing a career in Alaska Tourism. The deadline to apply is January 31st. [Website found here.](#)

FEBRUARY 2022

12. SWE Greatland Section Scholarship offers one \$2,000 and two \$1,500 scholarships to female high school seniors in Alaska planning to pursue a degree in engineering. The deadline to apply is February 10th. [Apply here.](#)

13. The Dr. Amanda Perez Scholarship is for high school seniors and college freshmen. To be eligible, you must reside in Arizona, California, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, Idaho. You must also study humanities and social sciences. The amount varies and the deadline to apply is February 15th. [More details here.](#)

14. The Dreamers of Tomorrow Scholarship helps support undocumented medical and pre-medical students attending school in the LMSA West Region states (Arizona, California, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho). This organization awards two scholarship recipients with a

one-time scholarship, in the amount of \$1,800. To be eligible, you must be committed to pursuing a career in medicine and dedicated to serving the Latino and underserved communities. The deadline to apply is February 15th. [More info. Here.](#)

15. Wanda Munn Scholarship (SWE Eastern Washington Section) is for \$1,500. This award is open to re-entry/nontraditional female students who plan to major in engineering and have completed two or more years of full-time credits (does not have to be in an engineering curriculum). Students must reside or attend school in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, or Washington, and have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher. The deadline is February 15th. [Learn more here.](#)

16. Henry & Joyce W. Sumid Scholarship is for \$5,000. It's designed to support future stage actors, designers, directors, and playwrights who adore the drama profession. Applications are accepted from select Western states, including Alaska. Qualified artists should submit a transcript, resume, Student Aid Report, and 500-word personal essay. To be considered, you must study theatre at accredited U.S. art schools, maintain a minimum overall GPA of 3.0, exhibit outstanding talent for theatrical performance, and demonstrate significant financial need. 17. Commit to Success Scholarship gifts an average amount of \$4,000 to students formally admitted into any four-year baccalaureate program. The program offers merit- and need-based tuition assistance beginning the junior year. Preference is given to first-generation college students. To be eligible, you must have graduated from an Alaska public high school, maintain continuous full-time enrollment with 12+ credits, show satisfactory academic progress with 3.0 GPA or higher, and demonstrate motivation and determination to succeed. 18. Tesoro Youth Leadership Awards provides 20 recipients a \$2,500 award. High school seniors are selected from 19 Western states, such as Alaska. Students are rewarded for writing 500-word essays filled with examples of how they exhibit Tesoro's values of integrity and respect. To be considered, you must hold U.S. citizenship or legal residency status, be leading role models in their school community, matriculate at accredited colleges or universities full-time, and maintain a minimum high school GPA of 3.0. MARCH 2022

- 19. Northwest Section Mike Albers/Production Engineering Scholarship** is for \$500. This scholarship is available for U.S. undergraduate students who are majoring in welding or a related metalworking field. Applicants must reside in Alaska or Washington. The deadline is March 1st. [Apply here.](#)
- 20. The Alaska Airmen** are proud to support the growth of aviation as an industry and lifestyle. We partner with aviation legends to award scholarships each year, designed with the next generation of aviators in mind. We all know how expensive the aviation industry is, which is why we are so excited to give over ten thousand dollars towards a career in aviation. Our scholarships are as diverse as the aviation industry itself. High school seniors are eligible, with acceptance letters from aviation schools or recommendation letters from a CFI. Must have a 3.0 GPA, a legal US resident, no felony convictions, and have been a resident of Alaska for at least 2 of the last 3 years. The deadline to apply is March 1st. [Read more here.](#)

The Alaska Bar Association** offers law school scholarships to current 1st or 2nd year law students who demonstrate ties to Alaska, and an intent to return to Alaska within two years of graduation. Students must submit a personal statement in which the student discusses his/her ties to Alaska, intent to return to Alaska, career goals, reason for applying for the scholarship, and any other pertinent information he/she would like the scholarship committee to know about. - 22. June Nelson Memorial Scholarship** is for \$1,500. This scholarship is open to all Alaska High School Students pursuing post-secondary higher education. The deadline for applications is March 8th. [More details here.](#)
- 23. Carl N. and Margaret Karcher Founders Scholarship Program** is a \$10,000 award and up to ten awards will be granted each year. Students must be age 21 and under and reside in Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Louisiana, Nevada, New Mexico, New York, Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington or Wyoming. Students must also be high school seniors or graduates, who plan to enroll for the first time in full-time undergraduate study at an accredited or four-year college or university for the entire upcoming academic year. - 24. The Pride Foundation** offers scholarships to support LGBTQ+ and allied students living in the Northwest. Students must either be residents of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, or Washington (but may study anywhere) or be attending school in one of those five states. Applicants must also be pursuing a

post-secondary education of any kind. Current college students and those individuals planning to enroll in a program next year are eligible as are current high school seniors. The deadline to apply is March 13th. [Website found here.](#)

25. KEF General Scholarships are awarded to students with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher who are pursuing a degree through an accredited educational institution. 26. Shayna Marie Pritchard Memorial Scholarship. The applicant must be a senior at Nikiski High School. Strong preference will be given to applicants pursuing a career in Massage Therapy, or a trade/vocational degree. 27. The CIRCAC/James Carter Memorial Scholarship is for \$2,500. 29. Donald Handeland Scholarship is up to \$3,000. This is available to graduating high school seniors in Alaska. To be eligible, you must be an Alaska Resident enrolling in a 4-year accredited college or university as a full-time student, and going into a bachelors engineering or science program. 30. The Elmendorf-Richardson Spouses' Club (ERSC) Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to deserving applicants to further their education at an accredited educational institution. The Undergraduate/HS Senior award is given to graduating high school seniors who live in the Anchorage area, and who are the dependents of an active duty military member or retired military member. Rank is not considered in the application process. Students must be US Citizens with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. The amount varies and the deadline to apply is March 31st. [More details here.](#)

31. The Art Jess Scholarship. The minimum scholarship amount shall be \$1,000 per scholarship. This is open to Alaska residents who are Alaska Native, American

Indian, and/or Hawaiian Native, and is intended to assist Alaskans with their post-secondary education, including but not limited to trade schools, vocational schools, undergraduate and graduate schools, community colleges and distance learning. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 to be eligible. The deadline to apply is March 31st. [Read more here.](#)

32. Chef Cotter Scholarship Fund will award one \$1,000 scholarship to an Alaskan high school senior or student attending a post-secondary institution and pursuing a career in culinary arts or the hospitality and tourism industry. The deadline to apply is March 31st. [Apply here.](#)

33. McClain J. "Mack" Easton Memorial Scholarship is for \$1,000. This will be available to high school seniors. The applicant must intend to enroll in an accredited 2 or 4-year college or university in a degree related course of study or a vocational education program. The deadline to apply is March 31st. 34. Links, Inc. Scholarship ranges from \$500 to \$1,000. This scholarship requires a GPA of 2.5 or higher and plans to enroll in the following year as a full-time student in a four-year program at an accredited college/university or accredited technical/trade school. APRIL 2022

35. Dr. John Halligan Scholarship Fund. The scholarship will provide \$2500 to an undergraduate student studying the health sciences in pursuit of a medical career, to further help improve health care in Alaska. Applicants must be a graduate/in their senior year at an Alaskan high school and be enrolled/planning to enroll full-time at a University of Alaska campus. The deadline to apply is April 8th. 36. Dream to Fly: Jeff Cheng Memorial Scholarship will help a student who plans to pursue flying as a professional career. 37. The Gary Martin Swim Scholarship Fund is up to \$1,000. This is available to students entering or already enrolled in a post-secondary university or trade school, who were involved in competitive high school swimming in Alaska. The Spike Jorgensen Scholarship gives two awards in the amount of \$1,000 each to two deserving graduating seniors who demonstrate the need for financial assistance to further their academic goals. 39. **The Korean American Community of Anchorage** is for \$1,000. This foundation seeks to find future community leaders among all ASD high school seniors, who will contribute to a thriving relationship between Korea and Alaska. The deadline to apply is April 20th. [Apply here.](#)
40. **The Students of Integrity Scholarship** is an essay scholarship that recognizes students who personify and communicate ethics in the real world, as demonstrated through community service, personal integrity, and academic accomplishments. 42. **The Selma Weise Scholarship** is for \$2,500. This will be awarded to a senior who is preparing for a career in education. 43. **The Daniel Epps Memorial Scholarship** is for \$2,500. This is for current graduates who have attended Anchorage public schools for at least the last three years. Applicants must pursue a career in music, with special consideration to, but not limited to, applicants preparing for the teaching of music. The deadline to apply is April 26th. 44. **Bill Countryman Scholarship Program** is available to qualified Alaska applicants. Eligible applicants include individuals of any age continuing their education at an accredited college or vocational school or senior high students applying for admission to an accredited college or vocational school. 45. **The Margaret Frans Brady Scholarship Fund** is up to \$10,000. This was established to support arts and education projects and programs in Skagway and northern Southeast Alaska, and to assist students and artists in our area with scholarships to help them improve their creative abilities. MAY 2022

49. The UA Scholars Program is a \$12,000 scholarship awarded to Alaska high school students who are in the top 10% of their class at the end of their junior year as determined by their school. The Award may be used at any University of Alaska campus and is distributed in the amount of \$1,500 per semester for eight semesters provided the Scholar remains eligible. The deadline to apply is May 1st. [Read more here.](#)

50. Thomas K. Besh Memorial Scholarship Fund gives three \$2,000 awards to skiers. Eligible applicants must be Alaskan residents, have a 2.75 GPA, and be a high school senior, high school graduate, or attending an accredited university. The deadline to apply is May 3rd. [Apply here.](#)

51. Donald Giles Vocational Scholarship Fund provides three scholarships for \$5,000 each. To be considered, applicants must be a resident of the Petersburg, Seward or Homer community and pursuing training, certification, or a degree in

vocational or trade studies (such as HVAC, plumbing, electrician, refrigeration, IT, Heavy equipment or engine tech, culinary, welding, construction tech, office and biz tech, etc.) The deadline to apply is May 31st. [Website found here.](#)

JUNE 2022

- 52. Alyeska Pipeline Service Company's Alaska Native Scholarship** is for Alaska Native students in hopes that their education will lead toward a career with the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System. Applicants must have at least part-time enrollment, be enrolled as an undergraduate student in the business administration or environmental public health program or graduate student in one of our MBA programs, have a minimum 2.5 GPA, and demonstrate financial need. The Harvey Samuelson Scholarship Trust.** This scholarship is designed to allow residents of Bristol Bay communities pursue a higher education with the intent that they will return to their communities and improve them. 58. The Alaska Education Grant (AEG) program provides need-based financial assistance to eligible Alaska students attending qualifying postsecondary educational institutions in Alaska. The grant awards typically range from \$500 to \$4,000 per academic year. To be eligible, you must be an Alaska resident for at least 365 days prior to filing the FAFSA, and be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. The deadline to apply is June 30th. 59. Korean American Scholarship Foundation Western Scholarship ranges from \$500 to \$5,000. This is for students of Korean-American descent attending a school in Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, or Washington. Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and demonstrate financial need. The deadline to apply is June 30th. [Learn more here.](#)

60. The Alaska Performance Scholarship is available to all Alaska residents to help in covering the cost of Alaska Post-Secondary education. Awards will pay for tuition, books and fees up to \$1500 per semester. To be eligible you must be a graduate from an Alaska high school, attend an APS approved school, have a GPA of at least 2.5+, and have an ACT/SAT score of at least 21/1060 or have a WorkKeys exam score of 13+ alongside academic requirements. 61. The BBAHC scholarship is for \$1,000 and looks to assist Bristol Bay tribally enrolled residents to pursue technical, undergraduate, or graduate degrees full time in relation to the health field, with the intent to ensure the highest quality health care services to all member communities in Bristol Bay. 62. Alexis Buskirk Memorial Student Book Scholarship provides \$300 per semester for book expenses to APU degree seeking students who have been diagnosed with epilepsy. Deadlines Vary

67. The Western Undergraduate Exchange is a merit based scholarship for up to \$66,400. This is given to incoming freshmen who are non-resident applicants to the University of New Mexico. Applicants must be from Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington or Wyoming. It is renewable for four years, dependent on the completion of 15 credits and a 3.0 GPA each semester. Must have an ACT of 22 or an SAT of 1100, and a cumulative 3.0 GPA. The deadline varies. 68. NATAS Northwest Chapter has awarded over 100 scholarships and over \$200,000 to aspiring television professionals sharpening their storytelling skills at universities in their five-state region of Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Montana, and Alaska. 69. Boise State WUE Award. To be considered, you must be a US Citizen or permanent resident and have a permanent residence within one of the following participating states/U.S. territories: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, Guam, and Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands (CNMI). Must have a 3.4 GPA from high school, and maintain a 2.5 for
